Veteran of the Month



It is with great honor, we recognize Michael Castillo as UConn's Veteran of the Month for December. Michael Castillo joined the CT Army National Guard in August 2001, straight out of high school. While in Ft. Benning, GA. Michael watched the attacks on the World Trade Center live on TV. At first he thought it was a movie, until he saw the second plane strike and realized we were under attack. Then everything changed.

On Valentine's Day, 2003, Michael got the call from his Squad Leader to come down for formation the next day. They left for Iraq shortly after. They spent their time in Iraq working with the 3rd A.C.R, the 1st I.D., the 82nd Airborne, and the 1st Marine Division. They built buildings and cleared IED's off the side of the road and everything in between. They later deployed with Humvees that had can-

vas doors and trucks from the 70s and the 80s. So, when they got to Kuwait, they were given the green light to raid the local scrap yard for makeshift armor, which they welded to the vehicles to add iron doors; plates to shield the backs of the trucks carrying troops, and surrounded them with Concertina Wire to keep people off of them. They had the appearance of something out Mad Max driving through the desert!

Michael shares the military taught him what it's like to have real camaraderie, and what it truly takes to be a leader, which is to focus' on one's ability to motivate for a common cause. For them, he says, it was to do their jobs and go home. In his experience, the best leaders were the ones who used selfless service as the most powerful motivation tool.

Michael is currently in UConn's MBA program with a concentration in finance and management. He plans to use his education in a management position at his current job, or move over to another company where he can work to create and implement strategy. Michael also plans to do everything he can to give his 19 month old daughter all of the skills that she needs to pursue her own dreams and ambitions. In addition to his work, school, and family commitments, Michael is honored to serve as the Secretary and Treasurer of a non-profit organization called the Veterans Advocacy Center. Their mission is to provide veterans with the skills and therapy they need to better their lives.

Michael likes the atmosphere at UConn and finds it very welcoming, despite the size of the student body and faculty. In his experience, most people at UConn are very approachable and seem really willing to help each other out. He further states, "We're all in this together so to me it's comforting to have that type of learning environment." He feels there is a great network of veterans from every service here at UConn and says, "It honestly makes me feel very welcome to have so many fellow veterans all around at UConn."





If you are interested in applying to graduate school at the University of Connecticut and are a veteran you application fee is waived starting with the 2016 fall semester.

Active Duty, veterans, guardsmen and reservists.

For veterans, guardsmen and reservists: Submit a copy of your DD214 to gradadmissions@uconn.edu.

For active duty military:

- Option 1: Submit an official JST transcript to the University of Connecticut Graduate School at gradadmissions@uconn.edu.
- Option 2: Submit a letter from your commander or personnel office stating you are active military to <u>gradadmissions@uconn.edu</u>
- Option 3: Bring a copy of your active military ID to the Graduate Admissions Office for a staff member to review.
