Willis N. Hawley Service & Leadership Award Winner – Samuel Surowitz

Please join the campus community in congratulating Sam Surowitz as the winner of the Willis N. Hawley Service & Leadership Award. Sam Surowitz is a UConn student veteran who served in the Army from 2007-2011 and was deployed to Iraq, Afghanistan, and Africa. He continues to serve his country through the Army Reserves in addition to balancing his responsibilities as a UConn Student and Chief Operations Officer for the Veterans Student Organization (VSO) on-campus. Though this is Sam's first-year as a UConn student, you'd never know it. Under Sam's leadership, the VSO has been very active in coordinating events and establishing the organization amongst student veterans at UConn (i.e. spring hike in March, Movie Night, and coordinating fellow student veterans for a Q&A session hosted by Residential Life). Sam currently works for the Office of Veterans Affairs & Military Programs, via the VA Work Study program, in addition to serving on the Veterans Advisory Council on-campus to ensure that recently discharged veterans transition well into student life. Sam is an integral part of the UConn Veterans Community and he always works to serve his fellow students, to the best of his abilities.

Sam stated, that if he were to win this award, he would dedicate it to his friend and mentor, SGT Anibal Santiago of the 75th Ranger Regiment who died from a high altitude fall on his third deployment in 2010, leaving behind his wife, son, and two stepsons.

April's Veteran of the Month!



Philip served in the Navy as an Intelligence Specialist and was initially stationed in Tampa, Florida at MacDill Air Force Base, attached to United States Central Command's Joint Intelligence Center (2007-2009). During his time there, Philip worked in the Intelligence Dissemination Office and was deployed to Djibouti, Qatar, and Afghanistan. In 2008, he was recognized as "Tampa Sailor of the Year". In 2009, Philip rotated to a new home base-Naval Air Station Jacksonville, in Jacksonville, Florida where he was the Leading Petty Officer for a P-3 Squadron - VP-45. Additionally, he deployed to Okinawa, Australia, and El Salvador. Philip reached the grade of E-6 before his four year mark and was honorably discharged after 6 years of service (2006-2012).

After leaving the military, Philip worked on local and federal political onn's Master of Public Administration (MPA) program. During his second year in

During his second year in the program, Philip had the opportunity to put the analytical skills he learned into practice through his Capstone project with Achievement First Hartford Academy (AFHA). Philip also interned for the Newington Board of Education as a Communications Specialist during his second year of the program. While working as an intern for the Newington Board of Education, Philip developed a district-wide communication plan, wrote over 25 press releases and created a district promotional video. In addition to earning his MPA, Philip also completed his Certificate in Leadership and Public Management.

Philip currently lives in Simsbury, Connecticut where he is a Commissioner on the town's Conservation Commission. He recently served as Director of Public Relations for a successful State Senate campaign and works as a Communications Specialist for Traveler's Business Insurance, Strategic Planning and Execution.
