

January/February Veteran of the Month

The Office of Veterans Affairs and Military Programs at UConn is pleased to announce Alexander Teskey as UConn's Veterans of the Month for January/February 2017.

Alex served 6 years in the Navy as a submarine Nuclear Machinist's Mate. For the first two years, Alex was stationed in Charleston, SC for Naval Nuclear Power Training. Then, he was stationed at the Sub Base in Groton, CT on the USS Dallas (SSN-700) for the remainder of his time in the Navy. During that time, Alex and the rest of the crew on the USS Dallas were deployed two times to the Middle East and once to South America with dozens of shorter underways in between. After letting him drag her from California to South Carolina to Connecticut, Alex's wife Elly, and Alex finally decided to buy a home and settle down in Connecticut.

Alex has always known that he wanted to be an engineer, and the G.I. Bill has given him a fantastic opportunity to reach that goal to pursue a degree in Materials Science & Engineering. He's genuinely fascinated by how and why things work (or don't work). As a materials engineer, he'll have a much deeper understanding of the differences that make a successful design, or a spectacular failure. Outside of class, Alex is a member of the Veterans Student Organization and the treasurer of the UConn Skydiving Club. Alex was part of the UConn skydiving Team that won a gold medal at the National Collegiate Parachuting

<u>Championships</u> in Arizona in December and January.

As a leader in a particularly small but dedicated student organization, Alex shares he's had the opportunity to talk with his counterparts at several respected universities about starting and maintaining their student organizations. Most universities encourage students to start and participate in student organizations to form well rounded young adults. Where UConn leads the pack is its extraordinary devotion to that goal. In his experience, UConn provides more staff, mentorship, funding and are just more accepting of small or niche student interests, and Alex believes this attitude helps produce better adults. For Alex, it's exciting to see such a large organization striving toward a genuinely positive outcome through everyday operations.
