

### **CT State Library Job for Veterans**

The Connecticut State Library is looking to hire college students and veterans to work at our Remembering World War One Digitization Day events. This project holds community events centered around helping Connecticut residents remember and document the WWI veterans in their own families. They do this by interviewing family members and scanning or photographing the photos, letters and other keepsakes they bring them. These stories and images are then made available online for use by family, students, teachers and anyone with an interest in WWI.

This is an opportunity to get students involved in the commemoration of World War One while giving them some hands-on skills. They are looking for Veterans to do these interviews because it gives extra meaning to the families

they work with. Their knowledge of military lingo, documents and history provides an insight that is invaluable.

The positions are on a per event basis and compensation is \$15/hr. This funding is made available through a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

## Winner of the 2017

### Willis N. Hawley Service and Leadership Award

The Office of Veterans Affairs and Military Programs at UConn is pleased to announce Camden Craigie as the winner of the 2017 Willis N. Hawley Service and Leadership Award. This award recognizes a student veteran who has made significant contributions to the University Community. Camden has demonstrated a commitment to raising awareness and actively advocating for veteran's issues at the University.

Camden Craigie is a Navy veteran and a student attending the Avery Point Campus. Over the course of the year, Camden has been working in the Veteran Center at the Avery Point campus, providing services directly to fellow student veterans and he has been advocating on behalf of veterans there. Camden was an integral part of coordinating and facilitating a Veterans Day lunch at the Avery Point Campus, which was open to the entire Avery Point Community, including local citizens and law enforcement.

Currently, Camden is in the Electrical Engineering program at UConn and he will be attending the Storrs campus beginning Fall 2017. In addition to his work at the Veteran Center, Camden also serves as a tutor on-campus through the Academic Center. Within the first few weeks as a tutor, he surpassed the expectations of his supervisors at the Academic Center, quickly becoming one of the strongest tutors. In fact, at the beginning of Spring 2017, Camden was promoted to "Head Q Tutor" at the Academic Center. In addition to his role in the Veteran Center and the Academic Center, he also participated in Avery Point's "Cardboard Boat Race" and was active in the Avery Point Writing Club.

Camden is described by his supervisor as "the epitome of an engaged scholar . . . and his commitment to learning is evident: Camden is passionate in his studies as well as in his desire to build community."
