**Straight from The Federal Veterans Office** 

A provision of the Harry W. Colmery Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2017, known as the Forever GI Bill, changed how the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) pays the Post-9/11 GI Bill Monthly Housing Allowance (MHA). The law requires VA to pay MHA based on the zip code of the training location where you attend the majority of your classes. VA is in the process of modifying and testing its systems to make this change, however, you will continue to receive GI Bill benefit payments under the current rules until those changes can be implemented. If you are taking classes in multiple zip codes or locations other than your school's main campus, when VA updates its systems, your school will have to adjust your enrollment certification with this information. In some circumstances, this may result in a different MHA amount than what you previously received. You can search for MHA by zip code on the GI Bill Comparison Tool at <a href="https://www.vets.gov/gi-billcomparison-tool">https://www.vets.gov/gi-billcomparison-tool</a>. ### 5-Mile Memorial Run to Honor Kyle Milliken

The Kyle Milliken Memorial Run is an annual 5 mile run held at the University of Connecticut (UConn) in Storrs, CT on the UConn Track & Field "Bone Mill" training course. This run honors Navy Special Warfare Operator Senior Chief Petty Officer (SEAL) Kyle Jeffrey Mil-



liken who was KIA serving his country on May 5, 2017 in East Africa. Kyle was a highly decorated combat veteran with numerous awards and 10 deployments. He was an amazing father, husband, son, brother, and friend, whose passion for life was contagious. His sharp wit and magnetic personality made lasting impressions on everyone he met. Kyle was highly competitive in all aspects of his life. He displayed incredible talent as a dedicated warrior, yet he stayed grounded through his faith, family, and teammates. Kyle's captivating presence and colorful storytelling regularly had an entire room in hysterics. He was the cornerstone of his family, friends, and team. In 1998, Kyle walked onto UConn's Track and Field program where he made every single one of his teammates a better runner, athlete, and person with his leadership, dedication, and unwavering commitment and drive—the very foundation for his success as a SEAL and in life.

This race supports The Kyle Milliken Memorial Fund which was created in Kyle's memory to raise funds towards providing scholarship and capital project support to the UConn Men's Track and Field program.

### Veteran of the Month: September 2018

### Annette Montoya

The Office of Veterans Affairs & Military Programs at UConn is pleased to honor Annette Montoya as our Veteran of the Month for September 2018. Annette Montoya is currently at the Avery Point campus. She served in the United States military for over ten years. She joined the Army right out of high school and, after basic training and advanced individual training, she attended the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, California. Annette was stationed in Panama and at Kelly AFB in Texas as a SIGINT Spanish Linguist/Voice Intercept Operator. After her initial four years of active duty, Annette served in the Massachusetts National Guard while she attended the University of Massachusetts, obtaining her BA in Political Science. Later, after receiving her MA from the Monterey Institute of International Studies in International Policy, Annette served in the Army Reserves. In 1996, during the Bosnian conflict, she was deployed to

Europe in support of Operation Joint Endeavor.

In 1998 Annette received a direct commission as a Naval Intelligence Officer and transferred into the Navy Reserves. As a result of September 11, 2001, she was called to active duty in support of Operation Noble Eagle and Enduring Freedom, and served in the Kingdom of Bahrain. Annette resigned her commission in 2002 upon learning that she was to become a mother. In between deployments, Annette served as a federal law enforcement officer and retired after 26 years of service.

While it was her love of horticulture that brought Annette to UConn to study Sustainable Agriculture, and later Landscape Architecture, she soon became inspired by the idea of designing landscapes for children. Annette sought and received an individualized major, Landscape Design for Cognitive Development, and is now pursuing the third prong of her studies in cognitive and developmental psychology. Last spring Annette received an IDEA grant from UConn to design and build a children's cognitive garden at Avery Point, the campus that she has most recently been attending.
