Internships & Co-ops

Hear from **Brianna Stimson**, a Campus Manager from Collins Aerospace, and a UConn Alum/Navy Veteran.

Internships and Co-ops offer an invaluable way for you to gain hands-on experience in your potential field before graduating. It's a great way to try different avenues and get your foot in the door with a potential employer.

At **Collins Aerospace**, we aim to do the bulk of our recruiting in the Fall. This means that we post these **internship and co-op** opportunities in early September, recruit at Fall Career Fairs, and fill a large portion of our roles before the end of Fall semester. By researching these opportunities early on, you will have more options and increase your chances of receiving an offer.

Here at Collins, we offer the following sessions:

- Spring/Summer Co-op: January - August
- Summer/Fall Co-op: May - December
- Summer Internship: May - August

*All initial sessions are intended to be full-time, 35-40 hours a week, Monday - Friday. Co-ops are 7 months in length, internships are 3 months.

Veteran of the Month

Derek Mockalis

The Office of Veterans Affairs & Military Programs (VAMP) at UConn is pleased to recognize Derek Mockalis as UConn's Veteran of the Month. Derek is a UConn student who is part of the VA Work Study team in addition to serving on the E-Board of the Veteran Students Organization (VSO). Derek has been serving in the CT Air National Guard for 3 years, with the 103rd Airlift Wing, as an Aerospace Propulsion Mechanic. The 103rd works primarily with the C-130 Hercules, which is a medium size, four engine turboprop aircraft. Derek's job primarily consists of diagnostics, overhaul and general maintenance on the C-130 engines and its related subsystems. One of his most memorable experiences was helping the unit usher in a Mission Design Series (MDS) of C-130 to the base. Previously, the 103rd had H1 model C-130's, so the upgrade to the MDS H3, were newer model C-130's which have more modern systems, providing more accurate and accessible data. In the process of changing over to the new models, the 103rd had to prepare the older H1 aircraft for departure, and then when the new H3 models arrived they had to completely re-learn some of the C-130's newly updated systems. Derek shares it was a great learning experience and one of his most memorable times with the unit thus far.



At UConn, Derek is working towards a Bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering. One of his favorite things about being a UConn student is the freedom and flexibility of being at Storrs. There are a lot of different places and activities to do on campus or around the area. Derek encourages other military-affiliated UConn students to take advantage of all the programs available on-campus. "Whether it's VSO sponsored events or even a club activity, make your time here memorable, be proactive and even try something new."
